## Palm Springs, Ca. Post 2006 National -Rally April

The factory rep. reported that a new Alfa manufacturing facility in Roseburg, OR. will produce Motor homes and/or 5th wheels. It's unknown at this time if there will be a service facility there or when the facility will become operational. The property has been purchased and it's just a matter of time before the facility is built. Regarding the facility at Shafter, CA, it is still unknown if a service facility will be available there. A portion of the property has been sold and it has been decided to limit the facility to manufacture of some fiberglass parts.

The club members have requested that the National Rally's be:

- 1) Primarily social with vendors as well.
- 2) More seminars and less free time.
- 3) More vendors and more merchandise for sale

The National Board will endeavor to fulfill these requests at future National Rally's.

Mark your 2007 calendars early to attend the Roadrunners fall campout in America's Heartland at the Army Corps of Engineer Campground that is located on Council Grove Lake. The campout will be at the Canning Creek Cove Campground which was recently selected as one of America's "Top 100 Family Campgrounds."

The campground has 3 group camping areas with 36 having full hook-ups and 12 having water and electric. The campground does have a dump station and no additional charge for its use. The scenery is lovely, rolling green hills and trees around a nice lake!

For many years after the Santa Fe Trail was opened, Council Grove was the only trading post between Independence, Missouri and Santa Fe, New Mexico. Council Grove was once a bustling rendezvous point on the Santa Fe Trail for west bound travelers, freighters and traders who were crossing the plains. This point on the trail was also a place to restock supplies and repair wagons. Some of the pioneers would wonder if this was a good idea going west.

Now doesn't that kind of sound like what happens when Roadrunners gather? We restock our supplies (because our favorite sport is eating). We make repairs (because somebody always has something broken). And we plan our next trips and wonder what it will be like! (Because we are Roadrunners!)

Council Grove has 13 registered historical sites, other intriguing sites, a carefully preserved past, and is a treasure trove of history. Nearby you can still see portions of the Santa Fe Trail and its wagon wheel ruts. Or take a short drive to the Tall Grass Prairie Preserve and Cottonwood Falls Courthouse.

In addition to the activities at Council Grove and at the lake, day trips can be made to the Eisenhower Presidential Library & Museum in Abilene or if interested in military history, the United States Calvary Museum at Fort Riley.

It is too early to start taking registrations for this campout but it is <u>NOT</u> too early for you to mark calendar and remember it when making your travel plans for the fall of 2007. Look for the registration form in the next newsletter!

## **Recipe Corner**

<u>www.alfaroadrunners.com</u>, for all the latest updates on upcoming events and applications, the picture gallery of past events and the exclusive stuff available at the Roadrunner Store. Panzanella (Italian bread salad)

Capers, celery, anchovies, hard-cooked eggs, and tuna are also delicious additions to this salad. Serves four to six. Delicious on a hot day!!

1/2 pound Italian bread, 3 -4 days old, cut into 1 inch thick slices

½ cup cold water

1 medium cucumber, peeled, seeded and cut into  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch cubes. (may substitute celery) Salt

1/4 cup + 1 Tbs. red-wine vinegar

2 cloves garlic, minced

1/2 cup extra - virgin olive oil

Freshly ground black pepper

1  $\frac{1}{2}$  to 2 pounds ripe tomatoes (about 5), seeded and cut into  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch cubes.

1 medium red onion (4 to 5 oz) cut into ½ inch dice

½ cup loosely packed fresh basil leaves, torn

Sprinkle the bread with the water and let stand about 2 minutes. Gently squeeze the bread dry as you tear it into roughly 1 inch pieces. Spread the pieces of torn bread on paper towels to dry slightly, about 20 minutes.

Meanwhile, spread the cucumber pieces on a paper towel and sprinkle with salt. Let stand about 20 minutes to extract the bitter juices. Put the cucumbers in a strainer and rinse with cold water. Pat dry.

In a large bowl, whisk together the vinegar, garlic, and olive oil. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Add the cucumbers, tomatoes, onions, torn basil and the bread. Toss to combine and let stand until the bread has absorbed some of the vinaigrette, about 20 minutes.

Due to retirement and advanced seasoning, I'm not responsible for errors or omissions in this Newsletter. Until the winter then!
